EU funded incinerator project for the Seychelles

Incinco has recently successfully completed the installation and commissioning of two incinerator units for the Seychelles.

Funded by the EU European Development Fund the incinerators (one FS50 incinerator and one FS150 incinerator) are located at Port Victoria and Mahé International Airport, Seychelles.

Specifically designed to dispose of general waste, the units also handle kitchen and wet waste from the airport food preparation areas and the docks. The Seychelles Environment Ministry is tackling the problem of the Melon Fruit Fly and the incinerators are part of the exercise to combat these pests.

First tendered in spring 2006 and with signing of contracts in October 2006, Incinco designed, manufactured and then delivered both incinerators and associated equipment to Mahé Island by the end of the year. Both plants are fully automatic and are PLC controlled. They also have pneumatic ram feeders for safety and ease of use and full emissions monitoring packages to meet local environmental standards.

Incinco's team of specialist installation and commissioning engineers travelled to the island in March to install and commission the equipment and provide full local on site training. The units have now been handed over by the EU and Seychelles Government to the Port and Airport authorities.
